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#### **Dike Council Meeting Minutes & Claims** 4.10.24

April 10, 2024

The Dike City Council met for regular council meeting on Wednesday, April 10, 2024 at 7 pm with Mayor Six presiding. Council in attendance: Camarata, Feaker (by phone), Mikkelsen, Kauten and Lynch. Also in attendance: Marty Camarata, Diane Paige, Marv Geiken, Robert Heerkes, Jamie Buskohl and Craig Buskohl.

Motion by Mikkelsen to approve the consent agenda. Second by Camarata. All ayes, motion carried.

Fire/Ambulance report – the department had four ambulance calls and one fire call last month. Discussion was held regarding the purchase of a UTV by the fire department. The department stated it was needed for CRP burns, water rescues, use of trails if emergency and other emergencies. Council discussed the concerns of the purchase and future needs vs wants for the department including ambulances.

Resolution #0410202401, A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE ZONING CHANGE AT 627 4 TH STREET FROM R-1 TO R-3 AFTER RECOMMENDATION BY THE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMITTEE. Second by Mikkelsen. Roll call vote: ayes: Camarata, Feaker, Mikkelsen, Kauten and Lynch. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared Resolution #0410202401, duly adopted.

Pool repair assessment – Motion by Camarata to table until next meeting Second by Kauten. All ayes, motion carried.

Internet update – Kautén updated the council regarding internet and fiber project with Tyson Communications. A public hearing will be held once the ordinances are updated by the attorney.

City Emergency Medical District Levy information – Discussion was held regarding state code 357G which is a levy to tax for emergency medical services. It would be used for ambulance services. The maximum tax could be .99 per 100 of assessed value. Several steps would need to be done including petition, hearings, levy on the ballot for vote by citizens, maps and other steps. This tax levy not attached to city taxes; it would be separate with a board. It was discussed this could be an option to help with ambulance expenses such as new ambulances every ten years and other necessary equipment.

Ambulance purchase – Discussion was held regarding the purchase of a new ambulance to replace the 24 year old ambulance the department cur-

rently has. It was discussed regarding using ambulance mileage revenue and savings in the ambulance and fire IPAIT accounts to help cover the expense. The ambulance will take two years or more to receive. Bonding for the ambulance would happen closer to delivery. Camarata introduced Resolution #0410202402, A RESOLUTION TO MOVE FORWARD WITH THE PURCHASE OF A NEW AMBULANCE FOR NO MORE THAN \$326,000 AND BOND FOR THE AMBULANCE ONCE CLOSER TO DELIVERY AND USE AMBULANCE MILEAGE AND IPIAT SAVING ACCOUNT MONEY CLOSE TO \$160,000 SO BOND WOULDN'T BE FULL AMOUNT OF \$326,000. Second by Feaker. Roll Call Vote: Ayes: Camarata, Feaker, Mikkelsen, Kauten and Lynch. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared Res-

olution #0410202402, duly adopted. Mikkelsen introduced Resolution #0410202403, A RESOLUTION TO MOVE THE FY25 PUBLIC HEARING TO MONDAY, APRIL 29, 2024 AT 6:30 PM AND THAT IT BE PUBLISHED. Second by Kauten. Roll call vote: ayes: Camarata, Feaker, Mikkelsen, Kauten and Lynch. Nays: none. Whereupon the Mayor declared Resolution #0410202403, duly adopted.
